# Introduction

In 1914 discussions commenced on the possibility of forming a Royal Ark Mariner Lodge to be attached to Beaconsfield Mark Lodge, but the Great War intervened, then......

On January 29th 1919 the Beaconsfield Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners moored to the Beaconsfield Lodge of Mark Masters No. 205 was duly consecrated. On May 28th 1969 the Golden Jubilee Meeting was held and on May 7th 2019 so was the Centenary Anniversary Meeting.

It is very pleasing to record that the two Lodges have progressed steadily together over the 100 year period and also to record that almost without exception all the members of the Mark Lodge have subsequently joined the Royal Ark Mariners Lodge.

There will be few Masonic, either Craft Lodges, Royal Arch Chapters, Mark Masters or Royal Ark Mariners Lodges that will be able to claim 100 years of continuous existence, so this book is intended to record the facts and highlights from those years for future generations.

When the Golden Jubilee Meeting was held, a brief history of the Lodge from its start was assembled and the first 23 pages of that book are reproduced as they were carefully put together. Pages 24 through 37 held a list of Worshipful Commanders and Members who had come - and in time for most, had departed. Those lists are reproduced in this book but as a complete list from the first date to the present. No information has been lost and in many cases information has been added.

The more astute readers who might wonder where pages 3, 4 and 5 from the first 50 years have gone to. Between pages 2 and 6 was lodged a copy of the Golden Jubilee Meeting Summons which in 1969 had just 3 un-numbered pages. Modern day Masonic Summonses are usually four pages - though still not numbered, the last page traditionally carrying a list of current members and their contact details so that easy communication can be made amongst the Brethren.

Apart from giving the factual history, there is a fascinating story of survival as the Lodge moves between various venues in and around Southend-on-Sea. Freemasons Hall in Woodgrange Drive, formerly a Methodist Church, but now demolished and re-developed for local housing, was home to this, and our Mark Masters Lodge for no less than forty-six years after which we moved to effectively a purpose built Masonic Centre at Saxon Hall in 2006.

Read the history and enjoy.

In the beginning, on the 11th october 1917. The seed was sown, in open lodge of the beaconsfield mark lodge no 205 by a small number of brethren. In a distressed period of the first world war, it was unanimously voted that a royal ark mariners degree should be considered. It was agreed that the lodge committee should sit and discuss ways and means of support in its formation and report back at the next regular lodge meeting.

T WAS AGREED THAT A DONATION OF TEN GUINEAS TO BE GIVEN FROM THIS MARK LODGE TO DEFRAY EXPENSES OF THE CONSECRATION, ONE SHOULD NOT LOOSE SIGHT THAT FIFTY YEARS AGO A REASONABLE FESTIVAL MENU WOULD COST ONLY A FEW SHILLINGS, AND THE PURCHASE OF A GOOD QUALITY WINE WOULD BE A VERY SMALL AMOUNT.

IT IS PLEASING TO RECORD THAT ON THE DAY
OF THE CONSECRATION, THE LODGE WAS CLEAR OF
DEBT, ALL FURNITURE AND ORNAMENTS HAD BEEN
PRESENTED. THE BALANCE SHEET AT THE END OF THE
FIRST YEAR'S WORKING SHOWED A CREDIT BALANCE OF
NINE POUNDS NINE SHILLINGS AND THREE PENCE.

# LODGE of INSTRUCTION



FRONT ENTRANCE MASONIC HALL

THE SOUTHEND-ON-SEA MASONIC HALL, WAS A SOCIAL CLUB FOR MANY YEARS, A MEETING PLACE FOR FREEMASONS.

IN 1959 OWING TO AN EXTENSIVE BUILDING PROGRAMME IN THE TOWN THE CLUB WENT INTO VOLUNTARY LIQUIDATION AND CLOSED.

HE BEACONSFIELD LODGE OF INSTRUCTION MET AT THE MASONIC HALL FOR MANY YEARS AND JUSTLY SERVED ITS PURPOSE WITH THE ROYAL ARK MARINERS DEGREE UNTIL 1959. WHEN THE CLUB CLOSED DOWN, THE LODGE OF INSTRUCTION HAD NO CHOICE BUT TO MOVE TO ANOTHER PART OF THE TOWN.

THE LODGE OF INSTRUCTION MANAGES ITS OWN BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION, IT ALSO DONATES FROM ITS GENERAL FUND TO GIVE ASSISTANCE TO MASONIC BODIES, A DONATION WAS SENT IN 1954 TO THE HARWICH MASONIC FLOOD APPEAL.



FITER THE CONSECRATION MEETING ON 29TH JANUARY 1919 AT THE HOTEL VICTORIA, THE LODGE CONTINUED TO MEET THERE UNTIL 3RD MAY 1922. JUST ELEVEN MEETINGS.

OTEL VICTORIA WAS ONE OF THE FIRST PURPOSE BUILT HOTELS TO BE CONSTRUCTED IN THE CENTRE OF SOUTHEND-ON-SEA. ERECTED IN 1897 TO CELEBRATE THE DIAMOND JUBILEE OF QUEEN VICTORIA. IN 1959 THE BUILDING WAS DEMOLISHED.

FOR THE NEXT FIVE MEETINGS THE LODGE MET AT THE ROYAL HOTEL. THERE IS NOTHING IN THE RECORDS TO SAY WHY THIS MOVE WAS MADE OR WHY FOR SO SHORT A PERIOD. FOR THE CONVENIENCE OF THE MEMBERS, TIMES OF THE TRAINS FROM LONDON TO WESTCLIFF-ON-SEA WERE GIVEN ON THE SUMMONS.



THE ROYAL HOTEL,

ONE OF THE OLDEST
GEORGIAN HISTORIC
HOTELS IN SOUTHENDON-SEA. IT WAS BUILT
IN 1792 AT THE SAME
TIME THAT ROYAL
TERRACE CAME INTO

ROYALTY MADE SHORT VISITS AND STAYED FROM TIME TO TIME.

THE ADJOINING LAND

DEED DATED 1893, FOR
THE SOLE EXPRESSED
PURPOSE OF PREVENTING
WHEELED TRAFFIC TO BE
USED IN ROYAL
TERRACE.

By 1982 the Royal Hotel had long, long since ceased to operate as such. The building had a further floor added, and became offices called Princess Caroline House. Standing at the southern end of Southend-on-Sea's High Street, overlooking the Pier and the River Thames estuary, the author of this history update spent 21 years of his working life there. The old Hotel was very occasionally used as a small function room.



THE QUEENS HOTEL, HAMLET COURT ROAD, BUILT IN 1899, HOLDS A COMMANDING VIEW OF THE THAMES ESTUARY, AND SAW THE LAST OF THE STAGECOACH DAYS.

ITS BEAUTIFUL FLOWER GARDENS HAVE LONG SINCE BEEN REMOVED FROM VIEW AND THE SPACE GIVEN OVER TO THE PRESENT DAY MODERN CAR PARK.

THE LODGE MOVED TO THE QUEENS HOTEL ON 7<sup>TH</sup> MAY 1924 AND REMAINED THERE FOR THIRTY FIVE YEARS. IT WAS FOUND A MORE CONVENIENT MEETING PLACE FOR MEMBERS WHO WERE TRAVELLING FROM LONDON AND GRAYS. THE QUEENS HOTEL, BEING ADJACENT TO WESTCLIFF-ON-SEA RAILWAY STATION, WAS ONLY A SHORT WALKING DISTANCE TO THE LODGE.



N 3RD FEBRUARY 1960, THE LODGE MOVED TO WOODGRANGE DRIVE, SOUTHEND-ON-SEA, AND APART FROM UNFORSEEN CIRCUMSTANCES, IT WOULD APPEAR THAT IT WILL REMAIN THERE FOR ALL TIME IN THIS MOST LUXURIOUS BUILDING. KNOWN AS THE MINIATURE TEMPLE OF GREAT QUEEN STREET.

THIS UNIQUE BUILDING, ONCE A METHODIST CHURCH, WAS INSTITUTED IN 1848 ON THE SEA FRONT AT SOUTHEND-ON-SEA. ITS CONGREGATION WERE MOSTLY FISHERMEN, LIFE-BOAT MEN, SEAFARING MEN GENERALLY TOGETHER WITH THEIR WIVES AND FAMILIES.

IN 1923 THE CHAPEL MOVED TO WOODGRANGE DRIVE. AS YEARS PASSED, THE CONGREGATION BECAME REDUCED TO SUCH A LOW EBB THAT THIS PLACE OF WORSHIP WAS CLOSED.

THE FREEMASONS OF SOUTHEND PURCHASED THE WHOLE SITE AND CONVERTED THE BUILDING INTO A MASONIC TEMPLE.

(4) ELEVATION FEE RAISED FROM 10/- TO £1. 1. 0.

# BY-LAWS OF THE BEACONSFIELD LODGE OF ROYAL ARK MARINERS, No. 205

#### 1. Place and dates of meetings

The Lodge shall meet at The Southend Masonic Centre, Saxon Hall, Aviation Way, Southend-on-Sea, Essex, SS2 6UN on the 2nd Wednesday in May (Installation); 1st Wednesday in October and 1st Wednesday in February.

The days as shown may be subject to change should a religious holiday fall on one or more of the above, which affect a number of our members.

#### 2. Election of Officers and Installation

The Commander and Treasurer shall be elected by ballot and the Warder by show of hands at the regular meeting in February. The Commander Elect shall be Enthroned at the regular meeting in May and will appoint and invest the Officers.

#### 3. Candidates

The election of Candidates for Elevation, joining or re-joining shall be by ballot and two black balls shall exclude.

### 4. Annual subscriptions and fees

The amount of the annual subscriptions, payable in advance on the 1st April of each year, the fees for Elevation, Joining and Re-joining, shall be such sums as determined by resolution in open Lodge after due notice on the Summons. The amounts shall include all fees and dues payable to Grand Lodge, Provincial Grand Lodge and any other payment or financial liability incurred by the Lodge and/or Candidate for membership.

#### 5. Treasurer

The Treasurer shall receive all fees, dues, etc., and shall deposit them in the name of the Lodge, in a bank approved by the Lodge. He shall pay all accounts, and shall, at the regular meeting in May present an audited balance sheet of the Lodge accounts, made up to 31st March. The audit of the Statement of Accounts shall be carried out by the auditors in accordance with instructions issued from time to time by the General Board.

#### 6. Arrears of Subscriptions

A member more than six months in arrears shall not hold Office in the Lodge and if he be nine months in arrears he shall be liable to be excluded from the lodge by resolution after due warning by letter to him in accordance with Rule 118, Book of Constitutions and Regulations and no prior notice to members of the lodge of such resolution shall be necessary.

### 7. Scribe

The Scribe shall keep Minutes of proceedings of the Lodge, and separately of any Lodge committee. He shall issue summonses for all Lodge meetings, at least fourteen days in advance to every member of the Lodge. His services may be deemed equivalent to payment of subscription if he so desires.

#### 8. Lodge Committee and Auditors

The Lodge committee shall consist of the Commander, Wardens, Treasurer, Scribe, Director of Ceremonies, Almoner, Charity Steward and subscribing Past Commanders of the Lodge. The Lodge shall each year, at the Installation Meeting elect two subscribing members of the Lodge (other than the Treasurer and the Scribe) to act as auditors.

## 9. Resignation

A brother wishing to resign from the Lodge shall give notice, either in open Lodge, or by letter to the Scribe and, on payment of all dues, shall be entitled to a certificate of clearance.

## 10. Honorary Members

A Brother who has given distinguished service to the Order in general, or to the Beaconsfield RAM Lodge in particular may be elected an honorary member of the Lodge.

# 11. Lodge Effects

The Jewels and furniture of the Lodge are the property of the Commander and Wardens for the time being, in trust for the members. The Warrant of Constitution is the property of the Grand Master and the Commander shall be responsible for its safe custody, and shall produce it at every meeting of the Lodge.

## 12. Alteration of the By-Laws

Notice of Motion of any alteration of, or addition to, these By-Laws must be given at one meeting, then shall appear on the Summons for the next meeting and if approved, the alteration shall then be submitted for approval of the Provincial Grand Master and General Board.

### 13. Presentation of By-Laws

A copy shall be presented to each new member of the Lodge and to the Commander at the Installation meeting.





# **Lodge Workings Tools**

The Lodge 'Working Tools' were made and presented by Bro.Alfred Henry EGGLETON, a Founder of the Lodge


They were fashioned from wood and gunmetal, the wooden parts painted gloss black and the metal parts were gilded.

Bro. Eggleton also made and presented the 18 inch folding triangle. These were much admired by the Brethren, that as a mark of appreciation an inscription of the gift and the donor's name was placed on the triangle.



The first Porphry Stone used was 9 inches square by 1 inch thick and following a move to the "Masonic Temple" in Southend-on-Sea (this temple ceased to exist in 1959 as a result of extensive building in the town), a small corner came away (where marked 'A' and 'B' and shaded) so the stone was cut down to the triangular shape marked by 'C', 'D' and 'E'.

Later a new Porphyry Stone and Triangle was presented by W.Bro. Arthur Meyer, PCN.



# Membership

The comment in the Golden Jubilee History that the Lodge guarded its list of Honorary members has remained true in this latter half of the Century. Not surprising in the least is that after the first fifty years the only surviving Honorary member - W.Bro Sidney Claud LAUDRUM - has passed to the Grand Lodge above, but as this one hundred year milestone is reached the Lodge has just two surviving Honorary members, W.Bros. Michael Godfrey WALTERS and Eddie BULMAN.

This short list, though, hides the fact that over the second fifty year period the Lodge did gift honorary membership to a further fourteen Royal Ark Mariner Masons, W.Bros. Eric BOND and Arthur MEYER in 1969; W.Bro. Will CLARK in 1972; W.Bro. Ernest Aynsley ANDREWS in 1975; to the then PGM, Leonard Eros KIRK in 1975; W.Bro. Leonard BAUM in 1984; W.Bro. Peter LAMBOURNE in 2008; W.Bros. Cyril Selig PLASKOW, Cyril ROSENBERG, Leon MURRAY and Martin STATMAN in 2009; W.Bro. Charles ELMAN in 2010; W.Bro. Michael Godfrey WALTERS in 2013 and W.Bro. Eddie BULMAN in 2015.

On the following pages there is the list of the 100 members who have been accorded the support of the members of the Lodge to be the Worshipful Commander, and then the list of 350+ Masons who have either been Founders members, those 'Elevated' into Royal Ark Masonry, or Joined or Re-Joined the Lodge during its existence to date.

Although the Lodge was conceived during the First World War, (1914-1918) neither it, nor the Second World War (1939-1945) appear to have reduced the intake during those times and the in very difficult periods in the U.K. that immediately followed.

# As at the 7th May 2019 ~ Centenary Meeting

There are just 28 subscribing members and two Honorary members (all listed in green.)

Where the Lodge has seen fit to honour current members (at the time) with Honorary membership these are shown. There have been five other RAM Masons who have been accorded Honorary Membership though these were never subscribing members of the Lodge and are listed on the next page.

Over the 100 years of its existence, besides the **14** Founder members, the Lodge has 'Elevated' no less than **314** new Royal Ark Mariner Masons and welcomed **19** Joining members, **5** re-joining members plus the **5** extra Honorary members.

Only the dates of the meetings where new members have been admitted are shown and interestingly, whilst there is an influx gap in 1940-42 this gap does appear to be negated in the years 1943-45 – the years of World War II when one might expect new membership difficulties.

One problem that has turned up in the researches of the Minutes is the count of the number of meetings shown immediately after the meeting date. Over 100 years, with a constant 3 meetings per year, the meeting on February 6th 2019 should have been number 300. The meeting numbers 1 to 74 (in italics) have been marked and do confirm meeting number 75 on the 4th October 1944 which is the first acknowledgement in the many meetings Minutes. From there until the 276th meeting - the last of the handwritten Minutes - the numbers have been transcribed. There are 4 meetings when the meeting number in the Minutes does not sequence correctly. From meeting 277 the numbers once again have been inferred as the Scribe of the day ceased to number them (though they are correctly dated) but it has been agreed that we will confirm the Centenary Meeting as number 301 and continue correctly from there.

# Random thoughts of W.Bro. Dennis Baum.

This Royal Ark Mariner Lodge was consecrated during the time of the First Provincial Grand Master of The Essex Provincial Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons and subsequently there have been eleven more Provincial Grand Masters, as listed below; it is frightening to me to realise that I have known 8 of them personally!

I had the good fortune to be elevated into this wonderful lodge just over 42 years ago by my father, Derek Baum (elevated 1958) who was later to become an Assistant Provincial Grand Master and then the Deputy Provincial Grand Master, and in the presence of my grandfather Leonard Baum (elevated 1950). The longest serving members that I can personally recall are Will Clark (elevated 1928), Horace Chambers (elevated 1934), Edwin Bunting (elevated 1944), Aynsley Andrews (elevated 1950) and looking through the list of members, I can still recall virtually every member since 1961! We have been fortunate to have had many brethren who served the Province with distinction and were ultimately honoured with Grand Rank, the most active amongst them were V.W.Bros. Ernie Benjamin, Aynsley Andrews, Derek Baum, John Bermon and David Garston – I was just lucky! As well as Bros. Bill Harris, Will Clark, Horace Chambers, Len Bourdelot, Len Baum, Cyril Wedley, Cyril Plaskow, Dick Caldwell, Terry Birdseye, Stuart Jacobs and Len Abrahams.

Eight of our members have been honoured by being Worshipful Commander of Essex Enthroned Commanders Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners No. 1044 - being W.Bros. Ernie Benjamin, Aynsley Andrews, Will Clark, Horace Chambers, Derek Baum, Cyril Plaskow, myself and Len Abrahams.

I cannot let the opportunity pass without mentioning the outstanding service to the lodge given by its Scribes, in particular Will Clark - 15 years; Cyril Plaskow - 11 years; John Bermon - 13 years and David Garston - 21 years; their service spanned the use of a quill pen, typewriter, word processor and currently to the relatively recent inventions of the personal computer and email - though it has to be said that the writing of the Minutes in laborius longhand continued right up until May 2014.
